The year 2022 was filled with many changes at Pella Cooperative Electric Association. We said goodbye to several retirees who provided decades of steadfast leadership, and we welcomed the next generation of cooperative leaders who are eager to make their mark on the industry. As always, the directors and employees of the cooperative are on the job to provide a critical service that improves the quality of life for our members. The Annual Meeting is a great place to meet the folks who work on your behalf, and we hope you will join us. Plans are underway for the 2023 Annual Meeting

of the Pella Cooperative Electric Association. The meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, April 4 at Pella Christian High School.

Pella Cooperative Electric Association exists to provide reliable service at an affordable price to our members. Your board of directors is democratically elected to represent your interests and provide long-term vision while staying true to our guiding cooperative principles. One of the most important things you can do as a member is participate in the election of your board of directors. This year members will vote for three directors located in District 1, District 4, and At-Large. Be looking for your ballot to arrive by mail soon, and please return it by March 24. It's important to note that there will be no in-person voting at the Annual Meeting on April 4.

Despite rising prices for material and purchased power, the cooperative ended 2022 in a financially sound and fiscally responsible position. Net margins for the year were \$639,708 which were sufficient to meet all the financial requirements specified within our loan covenants. One of our seven cooperative principles is members' economic participation. Members contribute equitably to, and democratically control, the capital of the cooperative. One of the responsibilities of your board of directors is to determine when it is financially appropriate to return

that capital back to the members. We're pleased to report that the board of directors returned \$129,560 in capital credits during 2022.

Even while facing significant supply chain disruptions, the operations department at the cooperative work to provide members with safe and reliable energy. Our reliability factor was 99.985% for 2022. The average member experienced only eighty minutes of outage time for the entire year. Our line crew follows a comprehensive maintenance and inspection program to ensure your cooperative is providing a high level of service reliability.

Maintaining the poles, wires and equipment is only part of the equation to providing reliable service, however. We also need an affordable and reliable source of energy from our power supplier. Central lowa Power Cooperative (CIPCO) has been a dependable partner since 1972. The cooperative and CIPCO recently signed a new wholesale power contract that will extend our relationship for many years into the future. The energy market in our nation is filled with volatility and challenges, and it's important that the cooperative has secured a dependable source of energy well into the future through CIPCO.

Your cooperative does more than sell energy. Another important cooperative principle is helping to enrich our communities by supporting education programs that invest in the next generation of community leaders. Each year, the cooperative sponsors one area student to participate in the lowa Youth Tour to Washington D.C. The participating students then select one person to represent the entire state of lowa on the National Youth Leadership Council. For the first time in cooperative history, our local student, Maddie Schmitz of Pella, was selected to represent the state of lowa. We're extremely proud of Maddie and her accomplishments, and we're excited that Maddie will give a presentation at the Annual Meeting to share her experience.

Please make plans to join us at your 2023 Annual Meeting on Tuesday, April 4. The meal starts at 5:30 in the evening with a business meeting to follow at 7:00. Once again this year, we will give away some great door prizes at the conclusion of the meeting. We look forward to seeing you there.




